I have been involved with FFCA for four years. I have been involved with FFCA when we made big accomplishments such as: becoming a nonprofit; helping bills pass; training

new foster parents, Guardians Ad Litem and social workers; and when we spoke to legislators about improving the foster care system.

All the improvements to the Independent Living Program have helped me to be more successful. She helps me get what I need, when I need it and she spends time with me. I really think it makes a difference when social workers take extra time to really get to know the youth on their cases.
